Speakers

Aaron Burmeister, owner of Burmeister Logging has been in logging for over 35 years and has been a certified Master Logger since the inception of the program in 2004. Aaron currently serves on the Great Lakes Timber Professional Association Board of Directors and has served on the Forest Industry Safety and Training Alliance's Board of Directors. He is a life member of WWOA and a member of the Wolf River Chapter of WWOA. Aaron is actively involved in a wide range of educational and training activities for landowners, loggers, and foresters.

Sue Crowley is the Northeast Forest Tax Law Team Leader for the Wisconsin DNR, covering 17 counties in NE Wisconsin. She works with a team of 10 DNR Tax Law Specialists that administer and serve the Managed Forest Law and Forest Crop Law lands and landowners in these counties. Sue has over 16 years of experience in the DNR's Division of Forestry working as a Forester—mainly in Manitowoc County, an Area Forestry Leader in La Crosse and the Staff and Partner Services Section Chief in Madison. Sue calls Two Rivers home and enjoys bicycling and beach walks with her dogs.

Brad Mischler is a Procurement Forester for the Ahlstrom-Munksjö mill in Kaukauna. Brad procures wood including the biomass for boiler fuel, wood chips and round wood for pulp from Northeastern Wisconsin.

Bruce Krueger, Vice President of Krueger Lumber Company, Inc. based out of rural Manitowoc County, WI. He has been involved with the wood industry for over 40 years.

Bill McNea is a DNR Forest Health Specialist stationed at the Oshkosh Service Center. He began working for the DNR in 2001 as a gypsy moth suppression coordinator based in Green

Bay, and has been in his current position since 2013. He primarily works with the detection and management of non-native insects and diseases such as emerald ash borer, gypsy moth and beech bark disease. He currently serves on the executive committee of the National Gypsy Moth Management Board. Bill received a PhD in Entomology from the University of California at Berkeley.

Curt Rollman is a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Deer Biologist based out of Rhinelander, covering the northern and northeastern regions of the state. He graduated with a wildlife ecology degree from UW-Madison. He did his graduate work at UW-Green Bay researching deer impacts on a northern hardwoods forest. He has been in natural resources education and work for 14 years, 4 of which with the WDNR. When not working, Curt spends entirely too much time hunting deer or chasing his hounds through the woods. If he had other hobbies, he would list them!

Chuck Wagner is the owner of a 79-acre tree farm in Kewaunee County which he purchased in 1992, entered into MFL, and has planted trees 21,000 trees and conducted a timber harvest on. Chuck manages his mixed conifer hardwoods woodland for timber production and wildlife habitat and is currently dealing with the impacts of emerald ash borer. In addition, he's planted Christmas trees on a portion of his property and enrolled another portion in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP). Chuck also owns 40 acres in the Carnot swamp in southern Door County which he manages for wildlife habitat. Chuck is a strong advocate for conservation across the state and has served on numerous boards including Glacierland, WWOA, Kewaunee County's Board of Supervisors and Land and Water Committee, and the State Land and Water Conservation Board, among others. Chuck is also a member of the
